Thank you for your correspondence in connection with the scoping report for the site of a proposed wind farm development at Wear Point, Llanstadwell, Milford Haven. The proposed wind farm consists of four turbines, approximately 105 metres in height.

The site lies within close proximity to several sites of historic and archaeological interest and is situated within the limits of the registered historic landscape of Milford Haven Waterway; consequently, there is potential that archaeological material may extend into the application area. Therefore, as your professional archaeological advisors, we concur with component 3.42 of the scoping document, that **an archaeological desk-based assessment** should be carried out in order to inform the planning process. This assessment should be carried out to the Standards and Guidance of the Institute of Field Archaeologists.

On behalf of your Authority, Dyfed Archaeological Trust – Heritage Management can prepare a detailed **brief** on request to assist in the preparation of this desk-based assessment.

We also concur with component 3.41 of the report that consideration must be given to the impact of the development upon the Historic Landscape of Milford Haven Waterway. This Trust can advise on the need for an ASIDOHL (Assessment of the Significance of the Impact of Development on Historic Landscape).
