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# **Summary**

Archaeology Wales carried out an appraisal in June 2014 to examine the archaeological potential of a proposed housing development on land at Gwndwn Mawr, Station Road, Bynea, Carmarthenshire. The site comprises several small fields to the west of Station Road, Bynea.

The fields have changed little since the mid-nineteenth century, although they were surrounded by tramroads linking nearby coal, tinplate and brickwork industries in the eighteenth and nineteenth-centuries. There is little evidence to suggest the presence of significant archaeological features within these fields, although a site visit was limited because of dense verdant undergrowth.

#### 1. Introduction

In June 2014 Archaeology Wales was commissioned by the Lewis Partnership, Llanelli, to carry out an archaeological appraisal on a proposed housing development site (AW Project Number: 2248: Planning Authority: Carmarthenshire County Council; Planning Reference: S/30050). The site of the proposed development lies in Gwndwn Mawr to the west of Station Rd, Bynea, Llanelli, Carmarthenshire (NGR: SS 54852 99304; 13m OD; fig. 1).

The appraisal included an examination of relevant documentary, cartographic and aerial photographic sources, a site visit and an evaluation of the relevant Historic Environment Record.

The work was carried out by Dr Iestyn Jones in June 2014.

# 2. Site Description

# Location, Topography, Geology

The site area is located on the west side of Station Road and north of Cwmfelin Road within the village of Bynea. Bynea is approximately 1.5km to the west and north of the Loughor Estuary and 4km east of Llanelli town centre. The proposed site comprises an irregular area of 200m by 70m, including eight small fields surrounded by mature vegetation (fig. 2). The western-most field (field 1) is approximately 130m by 25m, with its longest axis aligned north-east to south-west, as are fields 2 and 3. Field number 2, to the east, is approximately 80m by 40m and field 3 is approximately 74 m by 25m. Two of the eastern-most fields (4 and 5) are aligned north-west to south-east. Field 4 measures 75m by 25m and field 5 is 100m by 20m. Field 6, adjacent to Station Road, measures 63m north to south by a maximum of 45m east to west and field 7 is approximately 45m by 26m. A small enclosure to the north (Field 8) measures 40m by 15m.

The local geology is made up of Swansea Member Carboniferous Mudstone, Siltstone and Sandstone underlying Devensian Till and acid loamy and clayey soils (BGS 2014, Soilscapes 2014).

# 3. Historical Background

Bynea (possibly meaning the 'bitterns') as a place name was originally associated with a farmhouse but has been used as the name of the Bynea Colliery (1837) and extended sometime before 1939 to incorporate the hamlet of Cwm Felin (Morgan and Owen 2007, 60). The area was an agricultural area located on the east side of Llanelli, a town that grew significantly during the eighteenth and nineteenth-century with coal, copper, iron and tinplate, the main products produced or exploited. Glynea brick factory, in Bynea, which produced silica bricks from Llandybie stone, depended on the railway and the tramway that linked it with Ysbytty Tinplate Works (DAT HER).

# 4. Desk-based assessment results

# **4.1** HER Data (fig. 3)

A search of all HER data within a 2km radius of the proposed housing development was carried out. A number of the nearest records refer to documentary evidence rather than identifiable features. PRN 21422, approximately 65m north of the western field, refers to the field name Cae Melyn (yellow field) recorded on the parish tithe map (Field 160 centred on NGR SS 54876 99449). The HER record entry erroneously suggests that that the field name is spelt Melin (mill) in the tithe apportionment when Melyn (yellow) is the actual spelling of the word used. These two words are occasionally misspelt and the confusion is further exacerbated by the nearby Cwm Felin road and place name.

Industrial activity is identified through a combination of documentary evidence and *in situ* physical sites. Evidence of the former includes General Warde's Apple Pit Railroad (PRN 30735), a tramroad linking several collieries, that was located east of the proposed site. Further evidence of colliery tramroads is recorded on the west side of the proposed site. Squire Evans and Beynons Waggon Road (PRN 30731), a 2km long route recorded as operating between 1750 and 1781, is listed near to the western boundary of the site, near the current Bynea County Primary School, as is Chauncey Townsend's railway (PRN 30732), a 0.20km section of tramway operating between 1760-1795.

Genwen Colliery, which operated intermittently between 1760 and 1908, is located 260m north-west of the proposed site's western boundary and the associated, but damaged, early nineteenth-century engine house, is a Scheduled Ancient Monument (SAM: CM 263; PRN 27969). The site of Glynea Brickworks, which operated between 1893 and 1926, is located approximately 130m south of the proposed housing development. A twentieth century Gospel Hall (PRN 15961) is located on the east side of Station Road, 80m north-east of the proposed site's north-easterly boundary.

# 4.2 Map Regression

## 1842 Llanelly (sic.) Tithe Map (fig. 4)

The tithe map of 1842 shows three field numbers within the area of the proposed site. The lettering is a little unclear, but Field 130 (modern field 1) and 129 belonged to Drainin Pieces (?) and were labelled Cae'r Gr..as (?) and Pencae Sais (top of the Englishman's field) respectively. Fields 4 and 5 are represented by field number 127 on the tithe map. This field is labelled Handir Cae Sais (Allotment of the Englishman's field). This was owned by Bwlch y Llydiad (Widening Pass). There is little development shown around the fields and Station Road at this date, but Engin (sic) Fach, the Engine House, is shown north-west of the site. There is no sign of Gwndwn Mawr at this time.

# 1879-1880 OS Map 1:2,500 (fig. 5)

The 1880 map shows Gwndwn Mawr (translated as large ley-land field) buildings and associated curtilage at the northern boundary of the site and the Plough Inn on land to the south. The railway line transects the landscape from north-east to south-west and Dynca Station is shown at the intersection of what are now Station Road and Cwmmfelin Road. Glynea (coal) Pit is shown to the south of Cwmfelin Road. Fields 5 and 6 are shown as one field at this time. A 'Well' is shown north of the (Field 2) site boundary and accessed by a footpath from Gwndwn Mawr.

### 1907-1908 Epoch map 1:10,560 (fig. 6)

The 1908 map shows the station as Bynea Station, and more buildings have been built along Cwmfelin Road, to the west of the Plough Inn. Fields 5 and 6 on the eastern edge of the site have been divided in to the present field pattern.

#### 1959-1964 Epoch Map 1:2,500 fig. 7)

Considerable housing development complete by the mid-1960s seems to have extended along the eastern side of Station Road. Three plots and associated buildings have also encroached on the eastern edge of Field 4 on the western side of Station Road. Gwndwn Mawr appears to have expanded north of the site boundary and the Well, seen on the first edition OS map, is not shown on this map.

#### 4.3. Aerial Photographs

# 1946 RAF aerial photograph, Black and White (Ref 106G UK: 1264) (fig. 8)

The 1946 image shows the Gwndwn Mawr buildings complex at the northern end of the site. One of the buildings is within Field 8. The terraced housing and gardens along the eastern side Station Road is shown mostly in place by 1946. The terraced houses were therefore built in the first half of the twentieth century. A dark linear field division is shown running south-east to north-west through the centre of Field 5. It is unclear what this feature may represent.

#### 1992 OS aerial photograph, Black and White (Ref 92 112) (fig. 9)

The Gwndwn Mawr buildings by 1992 appear to have no roofs and have presumably been partly demolished. The Field 5 linear division is no longer visible in this image.

# **5. Site Visit** (for field labelling see fig. 2)

A site visit was conducted on the tenth of June 2014 in dry and bright conditions. Access was gained by way of the trackway to Gwndwn Mawr located on the northeastern edge of the site. Due to the undergrowth encountered only limited access was gained to the site. The small enclosure (Field 8) was not accessible but some stone walling, approximately 1m high and relating to Gwndwn Mawr, was observed (fig. 13). Field 7 was very overgrown with grass and nettles, and surrounded on all sides by mature tall hedgerow shrubs and trees. Field 6 gently sloped from north to south and had not been grazed. Consequently, long grass obscured much of the ground surface. A number of wooden pallets or fencing sections were stacked north of the centre of the field (fig. 10). The eastern field boundary consisted of a 1.5m high hedgerow whilst the other boundaries consisted of mature and tall shrubs and trees. Field 5 was impenetrable due to the vegetation growth. Field 4 was again overgrown and had a recently erected wire and post fence bordering the rear gardens of the adjacent houses along Cwmfelin and Station Rd. A dump of corrugated zinc sheeting was observed in the centre of this small field (figs. 10 and 11). Field 3 sloped gently, drooping in height approximately 3m from north to south. This field had meadow grass, wild flowers and bracken growing throughout and was enclosed on all sides by mature high unmanaged hedgerows and trees (fig. 11). The rear walls of some of the gardens of Cwm Felin Road houses were visible in the south-western corner of the field. Field 2 sloped down gently from north to south towards the rear gardens of Cwm Felin Road. The southern hedgerow was approximately 1.5m high and was located to the southern side of a post and wire fence defining the rear gardens of houses. There were cattle grazing in the lower corner of this field (fig. 12). The remaining boundaries of the field were characterized by mature, untrimmed hedgerow shrubs. No archaeological features were observed within this field. The hedgerows around Field 1 did not allow access and consequently it was no possible to visit this field.

#### 6. Discussion and Conclusions

This desk-based archaeological appraisal was based on an examination of the historic environment record (HER), cartographic evidence, aerial photography and a site visit.

The HER record (appended) suggests that the proposed site is located in an area that was exploited for coal, and which developed a related industrial infrastructure including tram-routes, during the eighteenth and nineteenth-century. The map regression suggests that fields in the area have remained little changed since the midnineteenth-century. Gwndwn Mawr appears to have been built between 1842 and 1879. The Plough Inn appears to have been built in the mid-nineteenth century, possibly to exploit the custom of the workers associated with the burgeoning local industries and the railway station. Some encroachment on the southern and eastern edge of the site are related to the construction of houses in the mid twentieth century and Station Road appears to have been developed for housing in the decades between 1908 and 1946.

Remains of stone built buildings probably relating to Gwndwn Mawr were observed in the heavy undergrowth at the northern end of the site. No other features were observed in the accessible fields although the summer vegetation prevented a closer inspection. Documentary evidence suggests that historical industrial features are located around the periphery of the site. However, an appraisal of the available evidence does not suggest that significant archaeological features are likely to be encountered within these fields.






Fig. 1 Location of site







Fig. 2 Site plan and



Plotted HER data



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



Fig. 5 1879-1880 OS map of site (1: 2,500)







1907-1908 OS Map (1:10,560)








Fig. 7 1959-1964 OS map of site (1: 2,500)


