

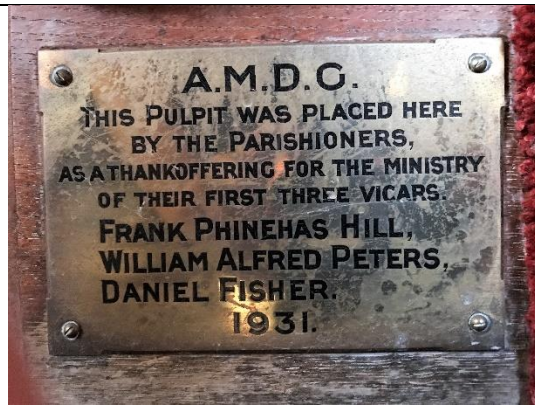

Organ



The organ is a two manual, mechanical action instrument by P.G. Phipps Organ Builders of Oxford, dating from 1910. There are 21 stops, 9 on the Great, 8 on the (enclosed) Swell and 4 pedal stops, with the usual couplers. There are also three combination pedals for each manual.

A stone cylindrical font, dated c.1900. Dark oak lid with cast iron decoration.

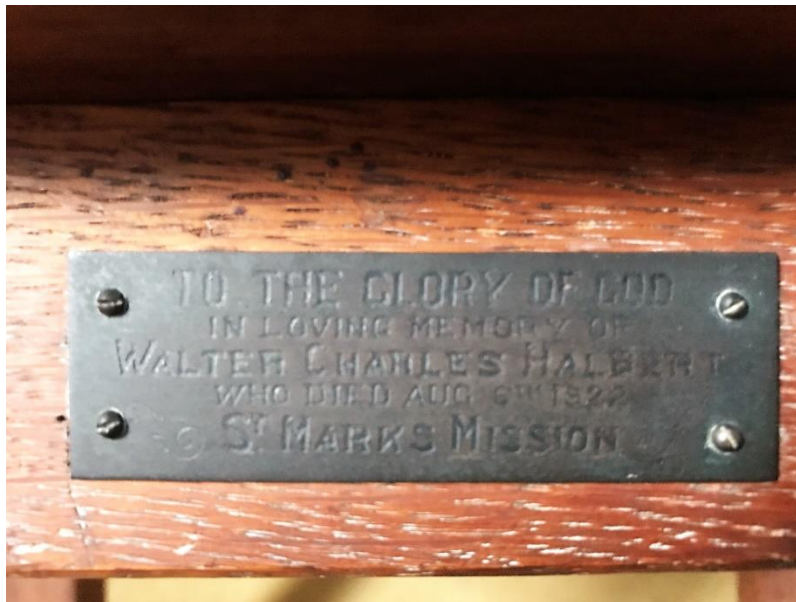
