## Catalogue of Decorative Iron Railings in Tenby

## Description

Tenby is fortunate in having a great deal of intact ironwork, much of fine quality from the late Victorian period. Unfortunately, when any of it is damaged, it tends to be replaced, if at all, by something inferior. This is, therefore an attempt to record before it is too late, all of the decorative iron (in some cases, steel) railings and gates in Tenby. It was produced over the period 2007 to 2013.

The catalogue seeks to be inclusive, regardless of quality or condition, although in some case, very plain modern railings have been omitted.

It does not attempt to give accurate or comprehensive detail of the ironwork in such a form that any of it could, for example, be recreated from these pictures, if it were lost. However, as for the most part a limited number of patterns are extensively reused, this catalogue should enable most property owners seeking to replace like-for-like to find complete examples elsewhere in the Town. It also provides a basis for those researching the ironwork of Tenby to assess the extent of different designs without having to conduct a survey for themselves.
